1. ADDITIONAL FEE FREE TRAINING PLACES IN 2023

Drawing on the success of JobTrainer, the NSW and Australian Governments have signed a 12-month Skills Agreement to deliver Fee Free TAFE and more vocational education places in NSW. Under this agreement, the Commonwealth will provide \$164 million for VET delivery and support. There will be 120,000 fee free places delivered in NSW in 2023 for priority qualifications.

The NSW Government recognises the important role private providers play in the delivery of VET in NSW and will be directing a portion of Commonwealth funds for fee free training places to Smart and Skilled providers other than TAFE NSW.

a. The NSW Fee Free Initiative

Fee free training places under this Agreement will be rolled out under a Smart and Skilled initiative known as “NSW Fee Free”.

With a number of existing fee free initiatives running in parallel in 2023, to minimise confusion some of the fee free initiatives detailed in Smart and Skilled Update No.180 (24 August 2022) will be rolled into NSW Fee Free. This will make it easier for potential students to identify their eligibility for a fee free qualification. Specifically, NSW Skills List Skilling for Recovery (SfR) Qualifications, for which fee free eligibility has been extended for the first six months of 2023, and all early childhood qualifications are now part of the NSW Fee Free initiative. The new arrangements are detailed below:

i. Fee free qualifications

There are 464 NSW Skills List qualifications on the NSW Fee Free priority qualifications list, of which 392 are current qualification and 72 are superseded. NSW Skills List SfR qualifications and early childhood qualifications are included. The list of NSW Fee Free priority qualifications is at **TAB A PG.30**.

Note

- Fee Free Apprenticeships and Fee Free Traineeships are not included and will continue fee free, as separate initiatives. Foundation Skills qualifications also continue to be fee free outside of NSW Fee Free.
- The following non-NSW Skills List SfR qualifications (see Table 1) are not included in the NSW Fee Free priority qualifications list. They will continue to be fee free for JobTrainer eligible students until May or 30 June 2023 as per the Quick Reference guide in Table 2 further down.

ii. Provider Eligibility

All Smart and Skilled providers, including TAFE NSW, with NSW Fee Free priority qualifications on their Approved Qualifications Activity Schedule will offer training fee free.

iii. Student eligibility

Smart and Skilled eligible students who meet the below enrolment and commencement timeframes can access any qualification on the list, fee free.

Note

Smart and Skilled students who meet the following fee free categories should not be enrolled under a NSW Fee Free waiver. They should be enrolled as per the usual fee exemption or fee waiver arrangements. These categories of students are:

- An Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander person
- A person with a disability
- A person who is the dependant of a person on a Disability Support pension
- A Fee Free Scholarship eligible student undertaking a qualification up to and including Certificate IV:
 - Concession eligible aged between 15 to 30 years
 - A person aged between 15 to 30 yrs who is or was in Out of Home Care
 - A person who is experiencing or has experienced domestic and family violence or their dependant.
- A refugee or asylum seeker on one of the specified visas listed in the Smart and Skilled Fee Administration Policy undertaking a qualification up to and including Certificate IV.

iv. Enrolment and commencement timeframes:

- **Enrolment period:** From 1 December 2022 to 31 December 2023
- **Training Commencement period:** 1 January 2023 to 31 December 2023

b. Notification of Enrolment (NoE) process

Three new waivers have been set up for the NSW Fee Free initiative. These waivers were live from 5 December 2022. The waivers are:

W461	NSW Fee Free – General
W462	NSW Fee Free – NSW Veterans
W463	NSW Fee Free – NSW Veterans-Recognised Partners

Smart and Skilled eligible students who meet the enrolment and commencement date timeframes should be enrolled under the 'NSW Fee Free – General' waiver when undertaking the NoE. This includes JobTrainer eligible students enrolling in SfR priority qualifications from 1 December 2022 but commencing training on or after 1 January 2023.

If the Smart and Skilled student is a NSW Veteran or a Recognised Partner of a NSW Veteran please use the appropriate waiver from the above.

The fees for Smart and Skilled students who already have a Commitment ID and who meet the enrolment and commencement date timeframes above will be retrospectively adjusted to \$0. Providers of affected students will be notified when this is done and will be required to refund students any fees paid.

Note

JobTrainer eligible students enrolling **and commencing** in:

- Non-NSW Skills List SfR priority qualifications should continue to be enrolled in the appropriate SfR waiver until 30 June 2023 – with the exception of CPP20218 Certificate II in Security Operations, where enrolments must be against the appropriate PAS and all enrolments and commencements must occur by 30 May 2023.

c. Fee Free Arrangements – Quick Reference Guide

d. Financial Caps

There will be no change to the Entitlement Full Qualifications (EFQ) and Targeted Priorities Full Qualifications (TPFQ) Programs Financial Caps currently allocated to providers for the 2022-23 Activity Period in response to the NSW Fee Free initiative.

The Fee Gaps paid to cover the student fees for students enrolled in eligible qualifications under this initiative are not covered by the Financial Cap. These are paid as additional subsidies. Only the Standard Subsidy is covered by the Financial Cap.

Note

- The Skilling for Recovery – Priority Full Qualifications Program (SfRPFQ) will remain in place until the end of the Activity Period. The existing student eligibility for fee-free Aged Care and Digital Skills qualifications through this program will not change. The program will not be funded for new commencements in 2023-24. The Financial Caps allocated for this program in 2023-24 will fund continuing students only.
- Commencements of SfR eligible students in the four SfR-only qualifications not on the NSW Skills List (see Table 1 above) will be allowed until 30 June 2023 only, except in the case of the Certificate II in Security Operations (PASs). where commencements must occur by 30 May 2023.

e. Updates to Smart and Skilled documents and related websites

All relevant Smart and Skilled material, including the NSW Skills List and the Smart and Skilled Fee Administration Policy, will be updated to reflect the NSW Fee Free initiative and circulated by early January 2023.

Between now and early January 2023, all relevant Skills NSW websites and Skills Compare will be progressively updated to reflect the NSW Fee Free initiative.

c. Fodder and forage crop-growing primary producers eligible for AgSkilled 2.0

Primary producers of fodder and forage crops are eligible for AgSkilled 2.0 funded training. Forage and fodder crops per the NSW Department of Primary Industries definition includes 'forage sorghum, pennisetum, millet, lablab, cowpeas, soybeans, grain sorghum and maize'.

d. Additional training providers endorsed to deliver AgSkilled 2.0 training – EOIs for training delivery sought

Two (2) additional training providers, **MySkills Australia** and **Signature Learning and Development** have been endorsed by the AgSkilled 2.0 Steering Committee to deliver AgSkilled 2.0 training.

4. 2023 TARGETED PRICE REVIEW PROCESS

In early 2023, Training Services NSW will undertake a targeted review of the Smart and Skilled price for selected qualifications. A similar targeted price review process was conducted in mid to late 2021, with KPMG supporting Training Services NSW to develop the review mechanism. Training Services NSW thanks all the providers that participated in that process.

The 2023 review will address several requests received from training providers and other Department priorities. The prices for approximately 20 qualifications will be reviewed.

Providers that actively deliver these qualifications will be invited to an initial information session in the week commencing 16 January 2023 about the process.

Participation is voluntary but strongly encouraged to help support the ongoing relevance of Smart and Skilled qualification prices and ensure the specific circumstances of your RTO are considered (eg delivery modes and locations).

The pricing review may reveal that current qualification prices are above or below the appropriate level (or may be about right) and may result in price changes being recommended to the Minister.

a. NSW Fee Free initiative

The NSW Government in partnership with the Commonwealth have signed an agreement to deliver 120,000 fee free places in NSW for priority qualifications in 2023. Enrolments in the initiative started 1 December 2022 for training commencing from 1 January 2023.

All qualifications included in the NSW Fee Free initiative are labelled as 'NFF' in the strategy column of the Skills List. Some existing fee free initiatives such as Skilling for Recovery (SFR) have also been included in the new NSW Fee Free initiative. Therefore, applicable SFR qualifications are labelled as 'NFF' on the Skills List. Four SFR-only qualifications that are not on the Skills List are still available under SFR until 30 June 2023.

b. Updates to the NSW Skills List – incorporating Training Package revisions

The NSW Skills List has been updated as a result of revisions to the following eight (8) Training Packages:

- Transmission, Distribution and Rail Sector
- Aviation
- Transport and Logistics

6. NEW INFORMATION RESOURCES ON THE DISABILITY STANDARDS FOR EDUCATION

The Australian Government has released new information resources on the *Disability Standards for Education 2005* (Standards). The Standards clarify the obligations of education and training providers, and seek to ensure that students with disability can access and participate in education on the same basis as students without disability.

These new resources have been co-designed with people with disability with the help of Children and Young People with Disability Australia (CYDA).

a. What are the resources?

The new resources provide easy-to-use information about the Standards and offer practical advice on how to navigate education systems from early childhood through to tertiary education.

There are four new resources:

- *Explaining the Disability Standards for Education* – this resource outlines what the Standards are and what they are designed to do.
- *Milestones and Transitions* – this resource is to help students and their parents and caregivers make their way through their education journey.
- *Advocating with and for your child: Primary School* – this resource is for parents and caregivers of primary school students.
- *Disability Standards for Education in Practice: Action Plan* – this resource is for students who are in high school or tertiary education.

Each resource has been translated into Easy Read format and Auslan, and Arabic, Chinese (simplified and traditional), Farsi, Hindi, Khmer, Korean and Vietnamese.

7. UPDATED VERSIONS OF THE SMART AND SKILLED FEE ADMINISTRATION POLICY AND SMART AND SKILLED POLICY FOR THE SKILLING FOR RECOVERY INITIATIVE

Updated versions of the *Smart and Skilled Fee Administration Policy* (version 2.8) and *Smart and Skilled Policy for the Skilling for Recovery Initiative* (version 3.0) have been released. The updated policies have been uploaded to the Smart and Skilled website.

The updates primarily relate to changes to fee free arrangements that have been communicated via previous Smart and Skilled Updates.

The updated policies take effect from 22 December 2022.

a. Summary of changes to the *Smart and Skilled Fee Administration Policy* (v2.8)

The main changes to the Smart and Skilled Fee Administration Policy reflect:

- The NSW Fee Free Initiative;
- North Coast Training Recovery Fund Fee Waivers;
- Foundation Skills qualifications will be funded under Entitlement Full Qualifications from 2023-2024; and
- Clarification of the record-keeping requirements for RTOs that sight evidence of a student's eligibility for Smart and Skilled and specific fee categories.

b. Summary of changes to the *Smart and Skilled Policy for the Skilling for Recovery Initiative* (v3.0)

The main changes to the *Smart and Skilled Policy for the Skilling for Recovery Initiative* reflect:

- The NSW Fee Free initiative – applies to qualifications on the NSW Skills List.
- Skilling for Recovery - approved qualifications not on the NSW Skills List will continue to be available fee free to students that meet the Skilling for Recovery eligibility criteria for enrolments up to 30 June 2023.

The content has been re-ordered and structured into numbered sections to reflect different arrangements that apply depending on the training commencement date.

8. TRADE PATHWAYS FOR EXPERIENCED WORKERS (TPEW)

Trade Pathways for Experienced Workers (TPEW) is a Trade Pathways Program initiative to increase the number of trade qualifications obtained outside of an apprenticeship. TPEW recognises the skills of experienced workers and provides a Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) pathway to trade qualifications. The initiative does not support students currently engaged in a traineeship or apprenticeship.

TPEW specifically targets experienced trade workers to increase RPL and gap training. TPEW is different to other Smart and Skilled programs which fund RPL. It has different student eligibility criteria and additional incentive payments for participating Smart and Skilled training providers.

a. Changes to Trade Pathways for Experienced Workers (TPEW)

In response to the critical occupation needs of trade-oriented industries, the number of eligible TPEW qualifications has increased from 36 to over 100 (see TPEW Priority Qualifications List – section e below).

The updated priority qualification list includes:

- All Certificate III apprenticeship qualifications.
- Occupation specific Certificate III traineeship qualifications that are aligned to trade industries.

There are currently 36 Smart and Skilled training providers approved for TPEW. The Department is seeking to increase the number of approved TPEW providers to deliver the enhanced qualifications offered across NSW.

b. How the program operates

i. TPEW payments and incentives

The TPEW program makes additional incentive payments for the delivery and reporting of a TPEW Performance Outcome.

A TPEW Performance Outcome is a TPEW eligible student who completes a Certificate III trade (or trade-like) qualification from the priority list **and** has three or more UoCs delivered and reported as RPL.

TPEW incentives are either \$1,500 (qualification eligible) or \$500 (qualification NOT eligible), plus the UoC price difference between the RPL and full UoC Smart and Skilled rate; meaning that RTOs receive 100 per cent (%) of the UoC price for UoCs reported as RPL.

TPEW Performance outcomes are defined in the *Trade Pathways for Experienced Workers Program - Policy (Version 2.3)* is available upon request.

ii. Program operation

Training under the program is managed via a supplementary Approved Qualifications Activity Schedule (AQAS). Submissions for training are through a Training Needs Identification (TNI) submission.

Training providers are initially paid the standard Smart and Skilled UoC price for gap training; and the standard rate i.e. 50 per cent, for UoCs reported as RPL. Only when the student enrolment has a 'Finalised' status, and relevant performance criteria are met, the incentives will be calculated and paid.

All training under the program must be completed and reported by **30 May 2024**.

iii. Student eligibility

At the time of enrolment, students must meet the Smart and Skilled eligibility criteria **AND** all of the following additional TPEW program requirements:

- be aged 21 years or older at the time of enrolment; and

- have a minimum of two (2) years of work experience in the trade that they will be undertaking training in; and
- be currently working in the industry associated with the qualification being undertaken, or have worked in the industry within the last five (5) years; and
- if undertaking an **Engineering (MEM) qualification** or **Baking (FBP) qualification**, the student must currently be working in the industry related to the qualification being undertaken; and
- not be a current apprentice or trainee; or if a cancelled apprentice, cancellation must be greater than six (6) months; and
- not be enrolled in any related Smart and Skilled subsidised training; and
- be assessed as capable of a minimum three (3) UoCs as an RPL (51) outcome; and
- no longer be at school; and
- be living or working in NSW; and be an Australian citizen, Australian permanent resident, humanitarian visa holder or New Zealand citizen.

9. END OF TRANSITION PERIOD FOR SUPERSEDED EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION AND CARE TRAINING PACKAGES

a. Overview

SkillsIQ, under the direction of the Children's Education and Care Industry Reference Committee (IRC) and a Technical Advisory Committee (TAC), completed an update of the Training Package Products in the Children's Education and Care sector in 2020.

On 19 July 2021, the training packages for CHC30113 Certificate III in Community Services - Early Childhood Education and Care and CHC50113 Diploma of Early Childhood Education and Care were superseded by CHC30121 Certificate III in Community Services - Early Childhood Education and Care and CHC50121 Diploma of Early Childhood Education and Care.

ASQA approved an extended transition period for these Early Childhood Education and Care (ECEC) qualifications. The extended training, assessment and certification issuance period for this qualification **ends on 20 January 2023**.

In late 2022, Training Services NSW submitted a proposal to ASQA to extend the end date of the teach out period for the superseded ECEC qualifications (CHC30113 and CHC50113) to 20 January 2024 to support students who are currently enrolled in the CHC30113 and CHC50113 qualifications and who will not complete their qualifications prior to 20 January 2023.

Training Services NSW received advice from ASQA on 13 January 2023 that the proposed extension request would not be approved.

b. ASQA information to support providers with transitioning Full Entitlement students and Trainees

c. New Vocational Training Guidelines (VTG) for Early Childhood Education and Care traineeships

A new Vocational Training Guideline (VTG) has been released (as of 20 January 2022) to support the changes to the Vocational Training Orders (VTOs) for traineeships in the Certificate III in Community Services - Early Childhood Education and Care and Diploma of Early Childhood Education and Care and is available at [Early Childhood Education and Care Traineeships \(nsw.gov.au\)](#).

d. Transitioning trainees to the new qualifications

The new qualifications released by the Australian Skills Quality Authority (ASQA) in July 2021 are **not** equivalent and **do not** meet the requirements for a Technical Variation under the *Apprenticeship and Traineeship Act 2001* (Section 21A).

Where the Registered Training Organisation (RTO) identifies that a learner will not be able to be deemed competent prior to the transition end date, the RTO must advise the parties of the transition to the new qualification.

i. Transition requirements for CHC30121 and CHC50121

These are as follows:

- Where an RTO transitions the trainee to the new qualification, the employer and trainee **MUST** agree to the change of term outlined in the Vocational Training Order (VTO).
- A variation form **MUST** be completed and signed by the parties. (The form must include the new vocation and qualification, as well as the extension of the term.)
- ii. Additional requirement for CHC50121 Diploma of Early Childhood Education and Care**
 - Where a training provider transitions the learner to the new qualification, as per the ASQA requirements, the learner **MUST** meet the entry requirement of holding either the CHC30113 or CHC30121 Certificate III in Early Childhood Education and Care.

This means students are eligible if they are:

- no longer at school, and
- an Australian citizen, permanent resident, humanitarian visa holder or New Zealand citizen, and
- living or working in NSW, or
- an Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander student who does not live or work in NSW but lives in specific defined interstate NSW border areas.

b. Priority industry areas

Funding will be available to Smart and Skilled providers to deliver part qualifications from the NSW Fee Free Part Qualifications List*, as attached to this update, in the following priority industry areas:

- Care Sectors (Early Childhood, Aged, Disability, Health)
- Hospitality and Tourism
- Construction
- Agriculture
- Technology and Digital
- Sovereign Capability (Manufacturing/Engineering and Defence)
- Sport and Recreation

Industry priorities may differ from region to region. If there is an industry need that is not identified on the list, please contact a Skills Broker or your Strategic Relationship Manager in your local Training Services NSW Regional Office to discuss funding opportunities.

* **This is not an exhaustive list of part qualifications. Providers can use this list to complete the Intent to Participate or design other skills groups.**

i. Evaluation process

The Department will evaluate Intent to Participate requests based on the demand for courses in each region. Priorities will also vary in each region based on industry demand for the range of skills included in the initiative.

Requests will be assessed against:

- the demand for training in the selected region/s;
- a provider's past performance under Smart and Skilled; and
- a provider's performance in delivering part qualifications (including funding usage, i.e. enrolment and commencement rates).

Training Services NSW will consider the viability of the requested part qualification delivery in determining which providers are successful and the amount of funding they receive.

ii. Next steps

If some or all of your Intent to Participate application is approved, you will be issued PAS(s) to accept.

All training must be completed **by 30 June 2023**.
